

3. KPIs

The impact and Key Performance Indicator (KPIs) have been measured considering the number of people reached, via MailChimp, direct email, and on social media. There has been a total of 10 newsletters until this moment (5 in this period of analysis). The KPI sets a target of 1,500 readership. Our analysis indicates an estimated audience of 5,778 individuals during the M16-M30. Additionally, they have been contributing to achieving other KPIs such as increasing the number of visits to the project website. This has been boosted by including links and calls to action to visit the website.




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

Interview with Davide Viaggi (UNIBO), Project Coordinator of BIObec







Interview with Helena McMahon from Munster Technological University (MTU)


"BIObec Project should create an EU-wide partnership to allow bioeconomy stakeholders across the EU to access education, training, mentorship, and work opportunities".





BIObec General Assembly Highlights



Last September 5th, the BIOBec Project hosted its General Assembly and plenary meetings in Vienna. These gatherings brought together consortium partners on and offline to present the project's current status and its six multilevel Bio-Based Education Centres (BBECs). The University of Natural Resources and Life Sciences in Vienna (BOKU) served as the venue, with Davide Viaggi, Project Coordinator from the University of Bologna, as moderator.

The following day, BIOBec's partner CTA organized the 'Cross-fertilization seminar among BBECs and Roadmap co-design experience,' a hybrid event that assembled a diverse group of experts in the fields of bioeconomy and education. This event was a part of the European Bioeconomy Scientific Forum 2023.

During this seminar, the roadmap for the establishment of BBECs was presented, and various working groups related to bioeconomy and education outlined the objectives of these centres. Over the course of two days, participants immersed themselves in the BIOBec methodology, gaining practical insights through the BIOBec roadmap co-design experience.


Meet Our Partners Interview with Katri Rusanen (UEF)



Interview with Lina Mayorga, from the University of Hohenheim








BlObec Capacity Building and 2nd Int. IRWG Workshop

BIObec Webinar for International Students





BIObec and CNR-ISOF collaborated to organize a workshop on bioeconomy at Parma University, where students were awarded prizes for their bioeconomy-related projects.




